The 4.0 litre MPI 6-cylinder Power-Tech Six delivers 177 horsepower and up to 224 foot-pounds of torque, making it the most powerful engine in its class. The 2.5 litre TBI 4-cylinder, with 121 horsepower and up to 141 footpounds of torque, is the most powerful 4-cylinder engine in its class. And Grand Wagoneer's standard 5.9 litre V8. All with outstanding trailer-towing power. Plus, there's Wrangler's optional 4.2 litre 6-cylinder with the best low-speed torque rating in its classup to 210 foot-pounds at only 2000 rpm.

Another Jeep powertrain advancement is the 4-speed automatic overdrive transmission available on selected models. It includes a fourth gear overdrive, lockup torque converter, electronic shift control, and a driver-selected shift schedule that lets you go from fuel-efficient "Comfort" to quick-shifting "Power" at the push of a button.

A major development in Jeep technology is the new optional four-wheel anti-lock brake system—an industry exclusive. Available on some four-wheel drive models, this advanced system features independent

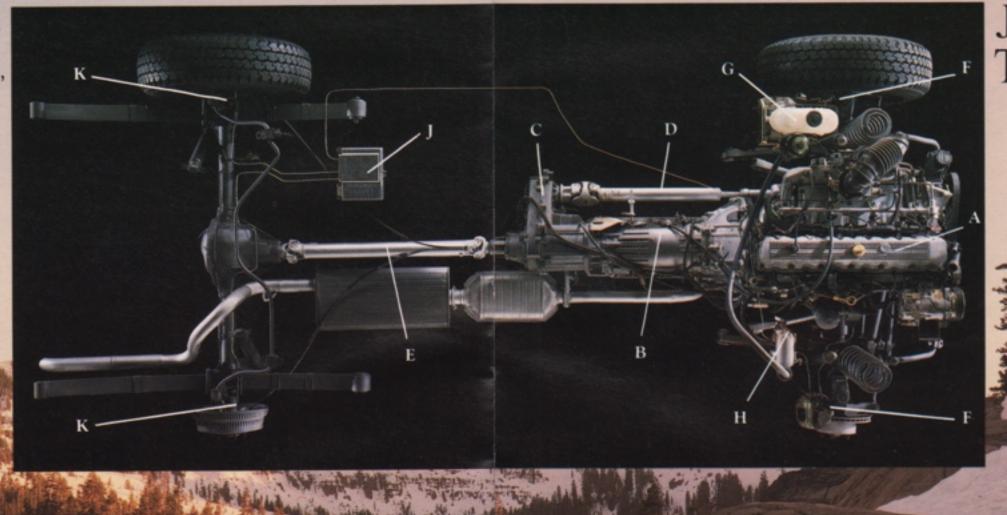

and durability, Wrangler features standard protective skid plates for the transfer case and fuel tank. And for serious enthusiasts, Wrangler is available with an optional Off-Road Package.

Wrangler offers a standard 2.5 litre TBI 4-cylinder engine matched to a 5-speed manual overdrive transmission. Or there's an optional 4.2 litre 6-cylinder (standard on Laredo), which can also be matched to an optional 3-speed automatic.

Inside, Wrangler is surprisingly civilized with full instrumentation, a long list of standard and optional

This year, there's the all-new Wrangler Islander that offers a standard charcoal soft top (or optional hard top), full carpeting, net door map pockets, Islander striping and sunburst decal, four P215/75R15 outline white letter all-terrain radial tires, and spare tire cover with Islander design. The rest of the lineup includes Wrangler, Wrangler Base, Sahara, and Laredo models.

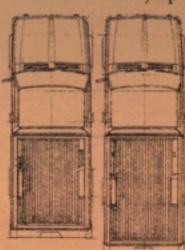
