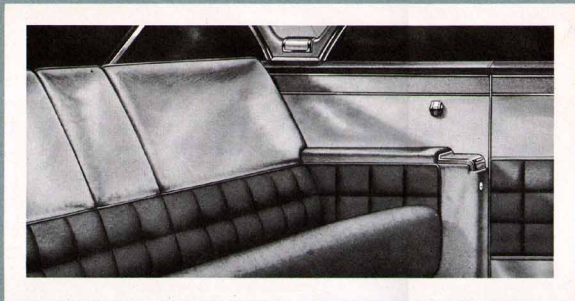

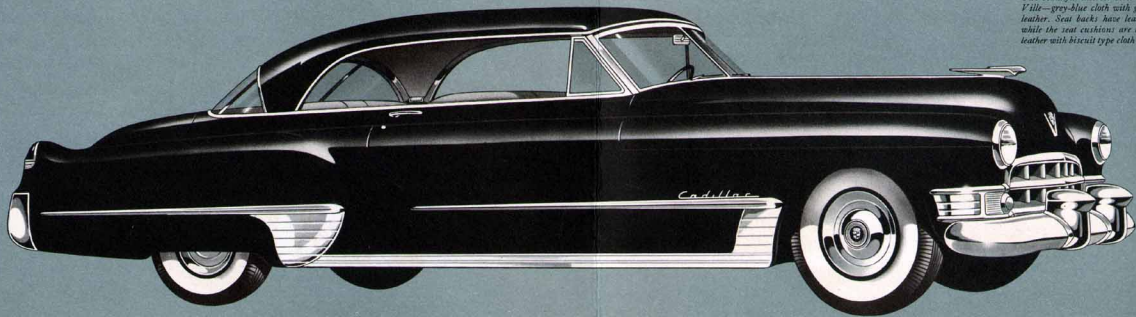
A distinguished Sport Coupe for a Discriminating Clientele

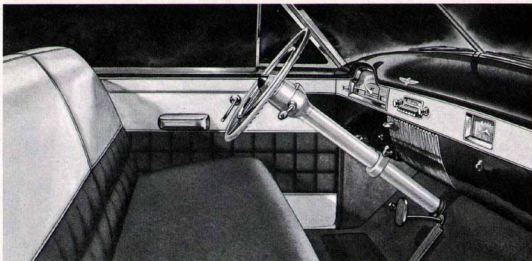
The Coupe de Ville, Cadillac's newest car—a sport model—has been especially designed for those who desire the finest possible automobile combining the smart, low-swept lines of a convertible with the comfort and convenience of a closed car.

Coupe de Ville interiors strike a new note in smart sophistication—always, of course, in the impeccable taste which is traditional with Cadillac. The combination cloth and leather upholstery is severely, yet beautifully tailored. Exposed top bows are in chrome finish. An impression of bright airiness is afforded by exceptionally generous window areas, narrow corner pillars and the newly styled rear window which forms a crescent extending the full width of the rear top area.



Two beautiful interior color combinations are available in the Coupe de Ville—grey-blue cloth with grey leather or coffee-brown cloth with beige leather. Seat backs have leather panels with biscuit type cloth inserts, while the seat cushions are trimmed in cloth. Doors are upholstered in leather with biscuit type cloth inserts. Top interior is in simulated leather.





The Coupe de Ville offers, in a closed car, many features typical of the finest sport models. All windows as well as the front seat are hydraulically operated. The driver's door contains control buttons for all windows, with individual controls also located on each door. The instrument panel is painted to harmonize with the exterior and interior colors. A wide selection of body colors is provided to harmonize with the two interior color options. The Coupe de Ville is built on a 126 inch wheelbase and is powered by Cadillac's new 160 horsepower V-type eight cylinder engine.
